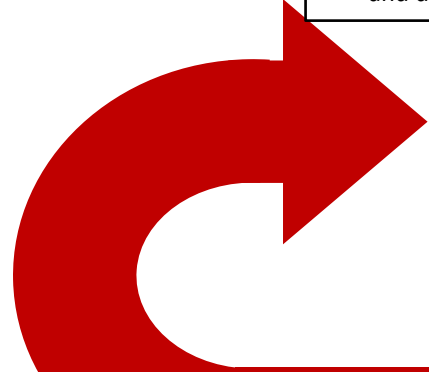
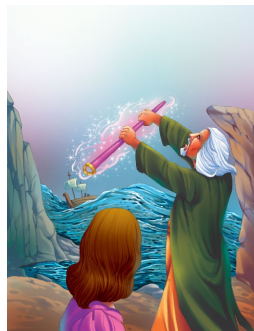




- Read and understand key ideas and concepts in prose, poetry and drama.

- Developing skills of visualisation and empathy to facilitate creative writing.
- Identifying keywords, word classes and inferring their impact to develop understanding of characters.



Spring Term



The Tempest

- Understanding the context of Shakespeare and his plays.
- Analysing language used to present Prospero, Caliban and Ariel, along with their relationships.
- Creative writing using figurative language and vocabulary for impact.
- Exploring key themes to understand Shakespeare's agenda.

Autumn Term

Welcome to Nowhere

- Exploring Omar's character development to present the impact of war.
- Understanding connotations of keywords.
- Developing speaking and listening skills to understand different perspectives.
- Discussing key themes such as: gender inequality; prejudice towards people with disabilities, international conflict; refugee journeys and borders.

Reading

- Competent word reading skills and know what to do when they encounter new words.
- Perform poems and plays aloud, taking note of intonation and tone.
- Present information they've learnt from a non-fiction text and provide justified reasons for their views.
- Recognise and discuss how figurative language is used by the author to impact the reader.

Writing

- Begin to write longer pieces using more imaginative and powerful vocabulary.
- Considering how authors have developed characters and setting.
- Summarising the main ideas drawn from more than 1 paragraph, identifying key details that support the main ideas.
- Using further organisational and presentational devices to structure text and to guide the reader.
