WELCOME TO FEATHERSTONE



THE EVENT IS DURING PSHE LESSONS

PSHE is the part of the curriculum covering areas such as careers education, relationships and other aspects of being a good citizen. The lesson you are part of is related to the careers programme.

During the lesson you will have 10-15 minutes to speak to the class about your job. Areas you might want to cover include the qualifications you gained, your career path and the highlights of your role. This is only a guide and Business Ambassadors interpret this successfully in a variety of ways. If you want to accompany your presentation with a Powerpoint on a USB this is okay, but not expected. After your presentation there will be an opportunity for the students to ask questions before the form teacher leads the remainder of the lesson. This is a series of activities which students work through in groups. During this you will be able to help, giving students a chance to speak further with you. This can be arranged 'face to face' or online.

HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE WEEK

Monday 2nd - Friday 6th Feb 26

New for 2026 - Featherstone High School will run its first ever Healthcare Week!

We hope to educate and inspire our students on the following areas:

What are health and social care services and how we appropriately access them here in the UK. What careers are available within our UK health and social care systems both patient facing and non-patient facing. What current innovations are happening within our health and social care services - such as future treatments, how healthcare will be delivered in the future and how AI is and will impact health and social care.

If your organisation or profession can support us with the following this would be so appreciated.

- 1. Workshops and Demonstrations: Organised hands-on workshops where healthcare professionals demonstrate basic first aid, CPR, and life skills related to health and social care.
- 2. Guest Speakers: If healthcare workers such as doctors, nurses, paramedics, and mental health professionals would like to speak about their roles and experiences in their field this could inspire future workers.
- 3. Health Awareness Campaigns: Collaborate with local health organisations to run campaigns aimed at educating students on topics such as mental health, nutrition, physical fitness, and substance abuse prevention.
- 4. Interactive Exhibits: Set up exhibits from local healthcare providers and education institutions showcasing their services, programs, and career opportunities.
- 5. Mental Health Awareness: Include sessions on the importance of mental health, stress management techniques, and available resources for students.
- 6. Volunteering Opportunities: Provide information about volunteering in healthcare settings, emphasising the importance of community service and experience.

By engaging you as employers and professionals in these activities, students can gain valuable insights into healthcare careers and the importance of health and well-being.
