

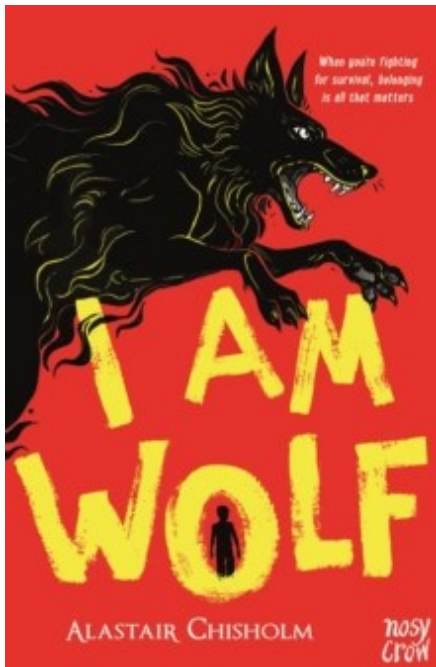


FHS Reads June 26

Welcome to the latest edition of our newsletter!

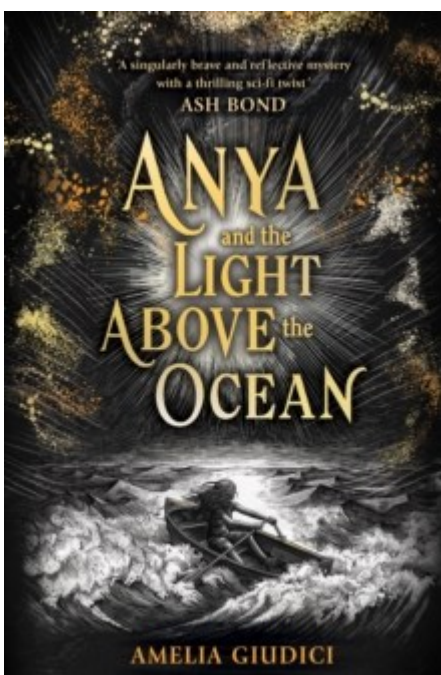
In this issue we feature books to read if you love football as well as some fantastic funny book recommendations.

Taking a boat out to sea, she encounters a strange window of light hovering above the waves.

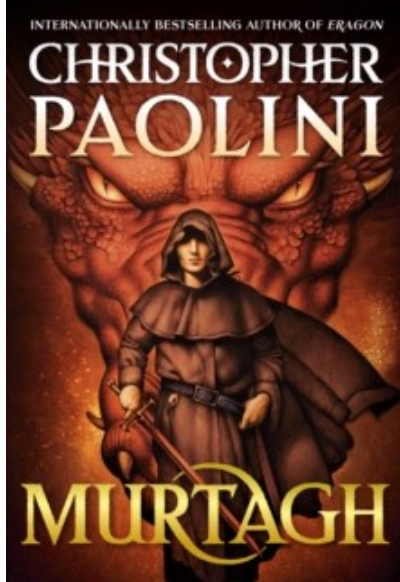
Transfixed, she reaches out to touch it. She then wakes in her boat, the sea now eerily silent.

Christopher Paolini returns to the World of Eragon in this stunning epic fantasy set a year after the events of the Inheritance Cycle. The world is no longer safe for the Dragon Rider Murtagh and his dragon, Thorn. An evil king has been toppled, and they are left to face the consequences of the reluctant role they played in his reign of terror. Now they are hated and alone, exiled to the outskirts of society.

Throughout the land, hushed voices whisper of brittle ground and a faint scent of brimstone in the air - and Murtagh senses that something wicked lurks in the shadows of Alagaësia. So begins an epic journey into lands both familiar and untravelled, where Murtagh and Thorn must use every weapon in their arsenal, from brains to brawn, to find and outwit a mysterious witch.

Follow his friends Mike, Lucas, and Dustin as they search for him and uncover a world of secret experiments and terrifying supernatural forces.

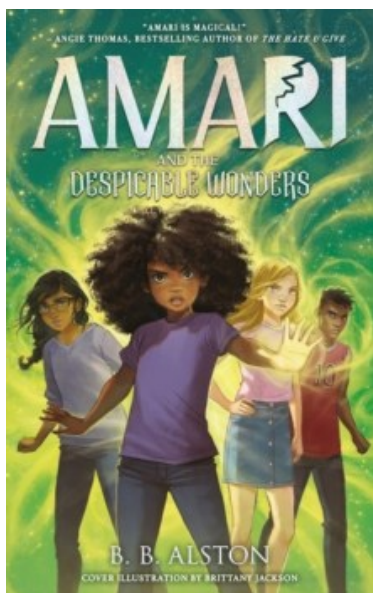
Is Eleven, a girl with incredible psychic powers, the secret to the mystery?

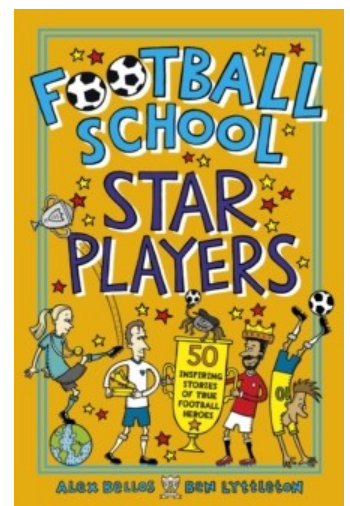
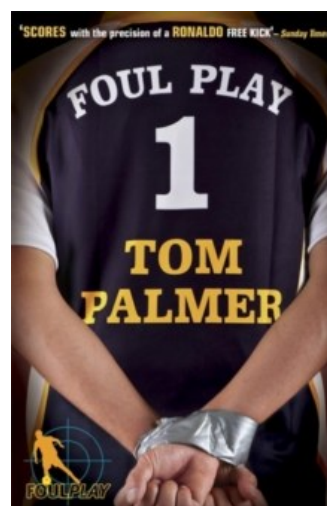
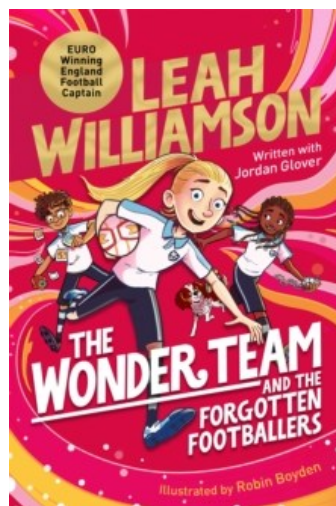
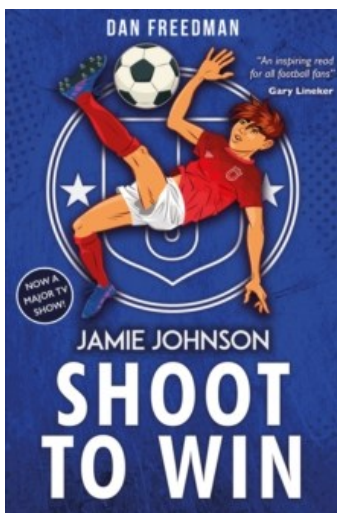
Striking Out

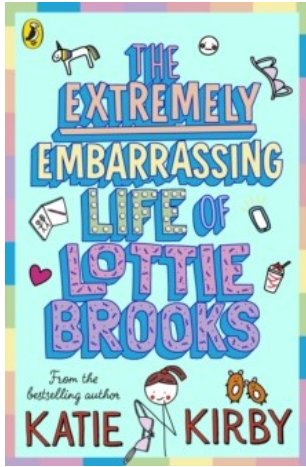

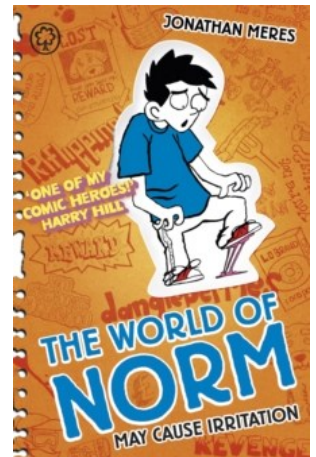
Genre of the month - Funny Fiction
